



## Pico da Neblina

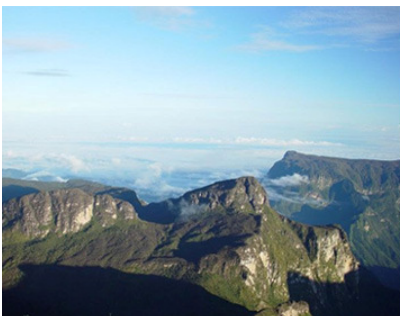


Located in the middle of the Amazon Forest, Pico da Neblina (Fog Peak) is the highest mountain in Brazil, 2,994 meters (9,822 feet) above sea level, at the Imeri mountain range (Serra do Imeri), which borders on Venezuela. Also, located within the limits of the park is the Pico 31 de Março (March 31<sup>st</sup> Peak) with 2,973 meters (9754 feet).

Pico da Neblina National Park is covered by dense and open Amazon Rain Forest, although other forms of vegetation, associated to high altitudes, can be also found in the area. The wildlife is very diverse, with some peculiar species, like the black-headed Uakari and the Guianan Cock-of-the-rock.

The park is also part of the Yanomami Territory and requires a special permission to be visited. There is no tourist infrastructure whatsoever and access is very difficult.

To get to the highest peak of Brazil is a dream and a challenge for all Brazilian mountaineers. Situated northeastern of Amazon State, this mountain also attract hikers from other parts of the world.



**Day 1** – Reception at São Gabriel da Cachoeira and transfer to hotel. In the afternoon, explanation on the detail of the expedition. Overnight

**Day 2** – Start the off-road trip on a truck up to the Community Yaramirim (03 hours). Then, we'll board on a regional boat towards Cauaburis River (03 hours), where we'll camp for the night.

**Day 3** – Continue on the boat towards Boca do Tucano (03 hours). From there, we'll start the trekking to Bebedouro Velho (03 hours walking). Overnight in our tents.

**Day 4** – Return to the trail and walk 5 hours (high difficult trekking) up to Bebedouro Novo, where we'll camp for the night

**Day 5** – Leave Bebedouro Novo towards our Base Camp – all day trekking on very high level trails – where we'll spend the night (already in low temperature).

**Day 6** – Trekking towards the summit. Hard trail through thick flooded and forest, with very arduous ascents (here we'll need ropes support). estimated time of 7 hours. night at the summit.

**Day 7** – Today we'll visit the *Pico 31 de Março* (March 31<sup>st</sup> Peak), the second highest point of Brazil. We return to our base camp for dinner.

**Day 8** – Trip back to the camp of Bebedouro Novo.

**Day 9** – From Bebedouro Novo we'll come down to the Tucan Waterfall, where we'll sleep.

**Day 10** – After breakfast, early departure to Boca do Tucano, where we'll board a local boat towards Yamirim, from where we'll continue by land (in a truck) to S. Gabriel da Cachoeira. Overnight at a hotel.

**Day 11** – Day free in S. Gabriel da Cachoeira. Overnight at hotel

**Day 12** – Transfer to airport to board to Manaus.

To get to São Gabriel da Cachoeira the best option is to take a flight from Manaus (flights by Trip Airlines)

### Important:

Level of difficulty: Very difficult > The access to the summit is not for the majority, it's important to be aware that the trail is very hard and tiring, with long walks in uneven and flooded grounds, going up and down. It's a exhausting. It's necessary experience, perfect physical conditions and willingness
